The Multipolar type set is a family of six, including Regular, Bold, Black, and each has their own corresponding italic. It is a round and tapered sans, though the minuscule l, i and j have serifs. The family includes no ligatures, however there are a few fascinating alternate characters including two ampersand options, an upper and lower case pi, an upper and lower case eszett, and two bullet points.

# Details & Suggested Uses

As with many other types, the cap line for ascending minuscules will slightly exceed the height of the magiscules. Additionally, as with other types, where a circular form would need to exceed its give vertical capacity, certain vertices emmulate this behavior. Brackets, parenthesis, curled brackets, slashes, and the vertical bar extend below the beneath x-height and/or above the cap height, to their own respective degree. Typically, the b, d, p and q will all share the same bowl shape, however I didn't want to make it that simple. the d and p share the same bowl, as well as the b and q, despite them facing different directions. The automated kerning space was increased with each weight for optical consistency.

In the process of creating the vector forms for the types, I discovered that the tapering theme allows for a fascinating stroked look. Obviously this family wasn't made for the purpose of readability, so this kind of creative tinkering & experimenting is precisely what it excels at. (The regular pair looks especially interesting when applying a stroke.)
